### ***The Assignment***

Prepare a bibliography of sources for your Wikipedia article project according to the Chicago Manual of Style. Include at least **FIVE** scholarly books, journal articles, or encyclopedia entries. Course texts and readings are acceptable sources in addition to other sources that you discover through your research. *The objective of this assignment is to create a list of sources early in the semester to help you to begin your research and writing on your Wikipedia artist.*

### ***Formatting***

- Bibliographies should be prepared using Microsoft Word with **TIMES NEW ROMAN, 12 pt. font, and STAPLED.**
- Wikipedia does not specify a format for citations, but the Chicago Manual of Style is the standard for scholarly writing in art history, so bibliographies should be prepared using this format. Samples of the most common types of citations are below:

  - **Book Chapter:** Buick, Kirsten P. "The Ideal Works of Edmonia Lewis: Invoking and Inverting Autobiography." In *Reading American Art*, edited by Marianne Doezema and Elizabeth Milroy, 190-207. New Haven: Yale University Press, 1998.
  - **Journal Article:** Simpson, Pamela. "Caroline Shawk Brooks: The 'Centennial Butter Sculptress.'" *Woman's Art Journal* 28, no. 1 (Spring-Summer, 2007): 29-36.
